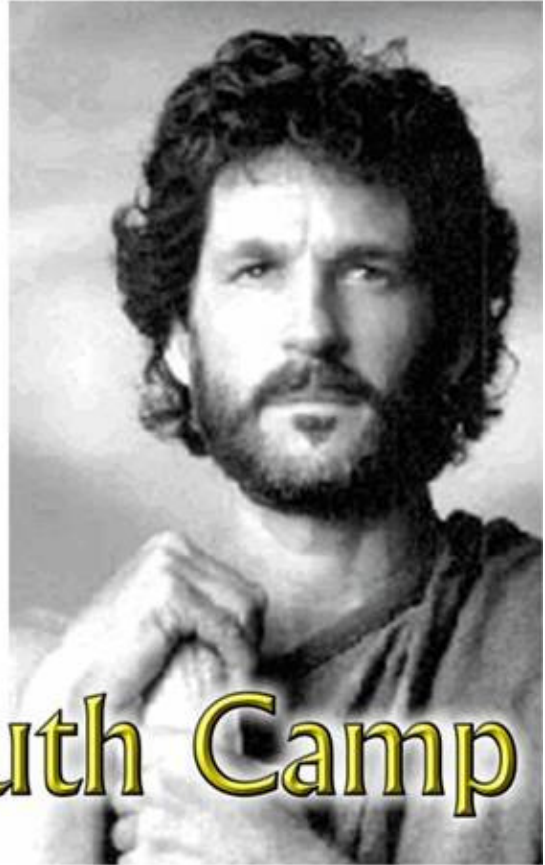

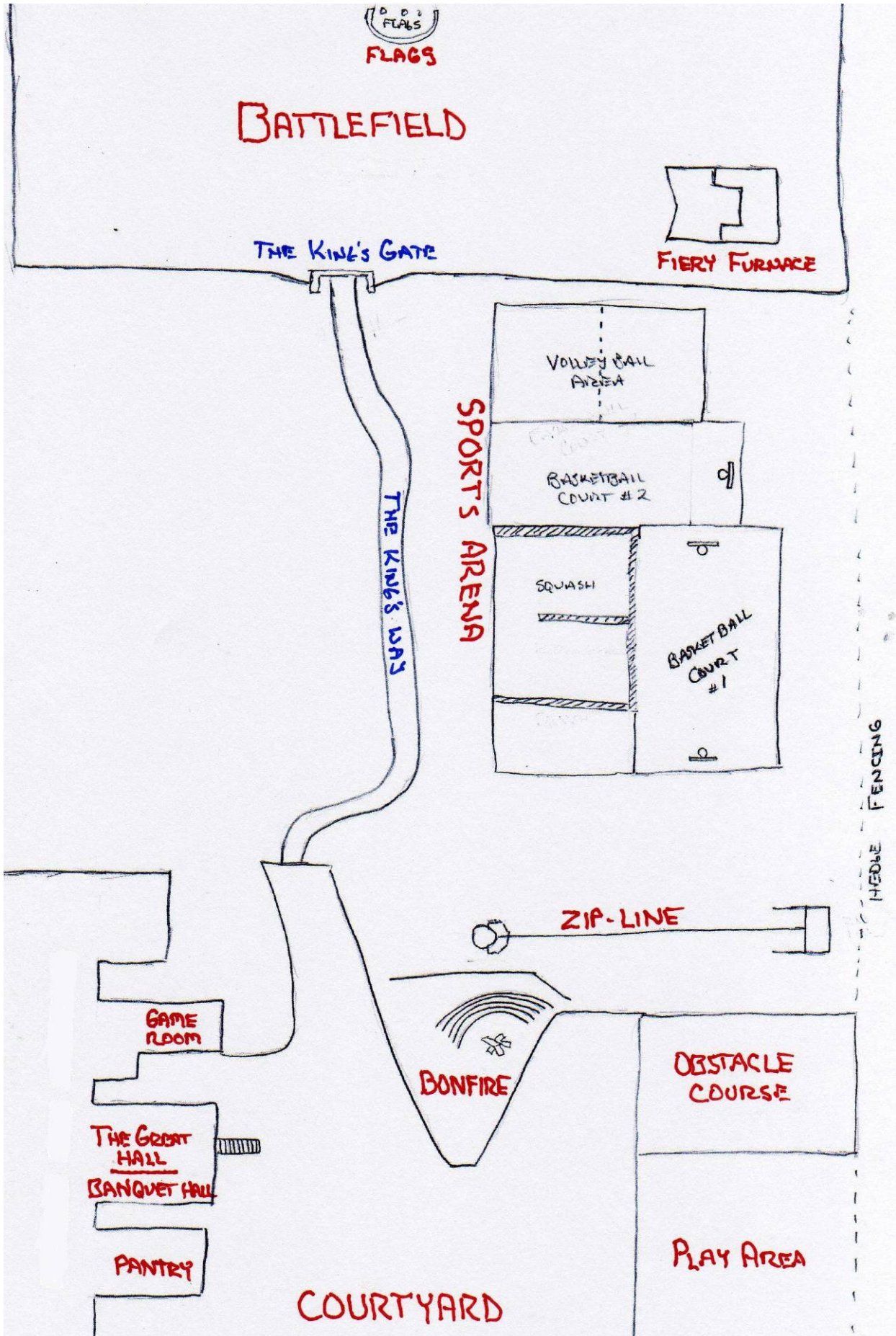

Brief Background on Jacob

About 2,000 years before the birth of Christ, a man was born who would fight and resist God's plans for his life until he became desperate to have only God in his life! That man's name was JACOB, and he would run from God for 96 years, until all the results of his selfishness and stubbornness came crashing down upon him late one night in a tent alone! But in that tent, Jacob met God! And even though they fought all that night, Jacob actually won! He did not win the right to do as he pleased anymore, but he won Christ, which means he sought and found the greatest treasure any man could ever own and that is "power with God!" From that moment, Jacob's name was changed to ISRAEL, and his family have since that battle been known as the people of God!

It all began when Abraham's son Isaac and his wife Rebekah had no children. As a result of prayer, Rebekah became pregnant with twins! It should have been a joyous thing to be having twins, but even in the womb, these two brothers Esau and Jacob fought. God spoke to Rebekah and told her that 'two nations were in her womb' and that the 'elder boy would serve the younger'. Esau was born first, red and hairy. Close behind him holding Esau's heel, was Jacob, *the supplanter*. He got his name when he grabbed hold of Esau's heel as if saying, "I won't let you or anyone get ahead of me!"

The boys grew. Esau became a 'cunning hunter' - an outdoors man, and Jacob was the opposite, he was 'plain man' who liked the indoors. He liked to cook instead of hunt. Unfortunately, the mother and father had their favourites; Dad loved Esau and mum loved Jacob.

One afternoon, crafty Jacob bought Esau's birthright with a single bowl of soup! Esau didn't care about his birthright and didn't care about his parent's opinion about who he should marry. He went out and married two Canaanite women which deeply saddened his parent's hearts. But the real conflict between Esau and Jacob came to a head when Jacob stole his father's blessing that were supposed to be for Esau by *deceiving* his father. Filled with anger and bitterness, Esau now hated his brother, and planned to kill his brother after their father's death.

Jacob had to flee from home that day, and headed out to find his mother's family. Amazingly, he arrived at his uncle, Laban's home and met Rachel, his cousin and fell instantly in love! Jacob quickly agreed to work for 7 years for Laban so that he could marry Rachel but Laban tricked him into marrying Leah, his older daughter. But Jacob loved Rachel, and so he agreed to work another 7 years so that he could marry Rachel too.

God blessed Leah with a number of sons (Reuben, Simeon, Levi, Judah) while Rachel could not conceive for many years. The conflict and competition between the sisters resulted in Jacob taking two more wives and more sons were born (Dan, Naphtali, Gad and Asher). Leah also bore more sons (Issachar, Zebulun). Finally Rachel conceived and gave birth to Joseph.

After 20 years of working for his uncle Laban, God told Jacob to leave and go back home. He sent messengers ahead to his brother Esau to see if things were any better between them. He soon found out that Esau was still very angry and bitter and that he was on his way to meet him with an army of 400 men! In his fear, Jacob realised that he was ruined! So alone in his tent he cried out to God for deliverance. An angel wrestled against Jacob that night but Jacob got the upper hand, and decided that he only needed God's blessings now, and would not let the angel go until he got God's help! The angel touched Jacob's thigh muscle and crippled him, and then blessed him, and gave him a new name - ISRAEL, a prince with God! The next day, Esau greeted his humbled, limping brother with hugs and kisses. What a welcome home! Jacob's humility changed Esau's bitterness!

But not everything was fixed yet! There was some serious troubles still ahead. Jacob's daughter Dinah got in big trouble with a boyfriend, and two of his sons ended up taking retaliation on an entire village! But God had called Jacob back to a place called Bethel to worship him there. God reconfirmed all the promises he had previously given to Abraham and to Isaac now to Jacob!

Jacob's son, Joseph, was sold into slavery by his brothers, and then became the second most powerful man in Egypt. Eventually, the family was reconciled and reunited in Egypt. Israel lived to be 147 years old! What a life!

Wednesday Morning Devotions - Setting Priorities

Isaiah 55:6 **Seek ye the LORD while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near**

Our time of morning worship of God is supposed to be a time where we set some priorities for the day, and when we look to Jesus for help and strength throughout the day! There are loads of things that we should do before we “do our own thing.”

Some important priorities are:

- Developing good habits
- Making time for God
- Giving and Tithing
- Praying about EVERYTHING First
- Putting Church before all else
- Keeping a Godly Life



Did you know that your life is ALWAYS going to be busy? If you “go with the flow” and do what everybody else does, you are never going to prioritize your life the way the Lord wants you to.

Most Christian young people never consider the importance of putting God FIRST. Matthew 6:33 says, “But seek ye FIRST the kingdom of God, and HIS righteousness...”

The Bible is God’s Blue-print for your life; not just in areas of salvation, but in ALL areas of Life. There is no problem that the Bible does not hold the answer to. It tells us what is important and what is not important. It tells us what to stay away from and what to stay close to. It tells us what to love and what to hate. And most of all, it tells us what pleases God!

Good or bad habits are usually developed when we are young. We think, as young people that we really don’t have to take God seriously. 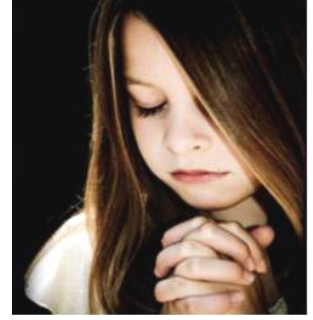

And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart. Jeremiah 29:13



Sometimes we don't know exactly what to say when we pray to God! We know prayer is simply from the heart, but our hearts can sometimes seem cold or blank at times. We can get a balance between random prayer and repetitious written prayer through using a simple structure or pattern as a guide to our morning devotional prayers.

The Biblical Truth About Prayer! Realise that you need to pray by faith and not by feelings. You might not feel like God is listening yet the Bible tells us so (Psa. 3:4). God wants us to pray to Him for those things we believe we need and He will then answer us (Psa. 118:5) Just be yourself, and talk to God about what is on your heart – are you thankful for something He has given you, is there something in your life that you are worried about?

Here is simple way to help you get the most out of your prayer time, and be confident that you have truly come before God's throne of grace. (Heb. 4:12, Psa. 19:14)

P—_____. *Psalm 92:1* “***It is a good thing to give thanks unto the LORD, and to sing praises unto thy name, O most High.***” We see in Matthew 6:9 that even Jesus praised the name of God. We should start our prayer by reflecting upon what God has done for us and in us. When we acknowledge God's greatness and blessings we are giving Him all the credit in our lives instead of taking for ourselves.

R—_____. When you begin to pray, you are entering into God's presence. You would never dream of visiting a king in dirty or shabby clothing. You would put on your best clothes and try to look your very best. So when you come before God you want to have a clean and pure heart. The Bible says in *Psalm 66:18*, “***If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me.***” If we have unconfessed sin in our lives, God cannot hear and answer our prayer.

A—_____. Don't you love if you ask your parents for money or something else, and then get what you wanted? There have many types of requests for God. Prayers we need to have answered. Sometimes we may need to ask for something material like money, other times we may need to ask for the salvation of a loved one. Whatever our request may be, God wants us to ask. *Philippians 4:6* says, “***Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.***”

Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time. 1Peter 5:6

Micah 6:8 says, “*He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?*”

Then he saith, I will return into my house from whence I came out; and when he is come, he findeth it empty, swept, and garnished. Then goeth he, and taketh with himself seven other spirits more wicked than himself, and they enter in and dwell there: and the last state of that man is worse than the first. Even so shall it be also unto this wicked generation.”

The truth is that you cannot think that you can just get rid of a bad habit and you will be okay – you have to **replace it** with something godly!

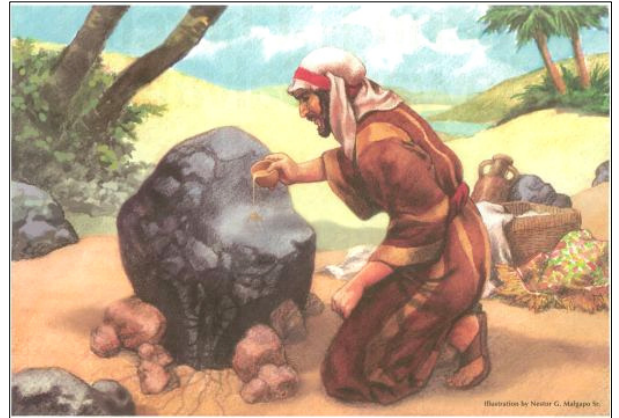
