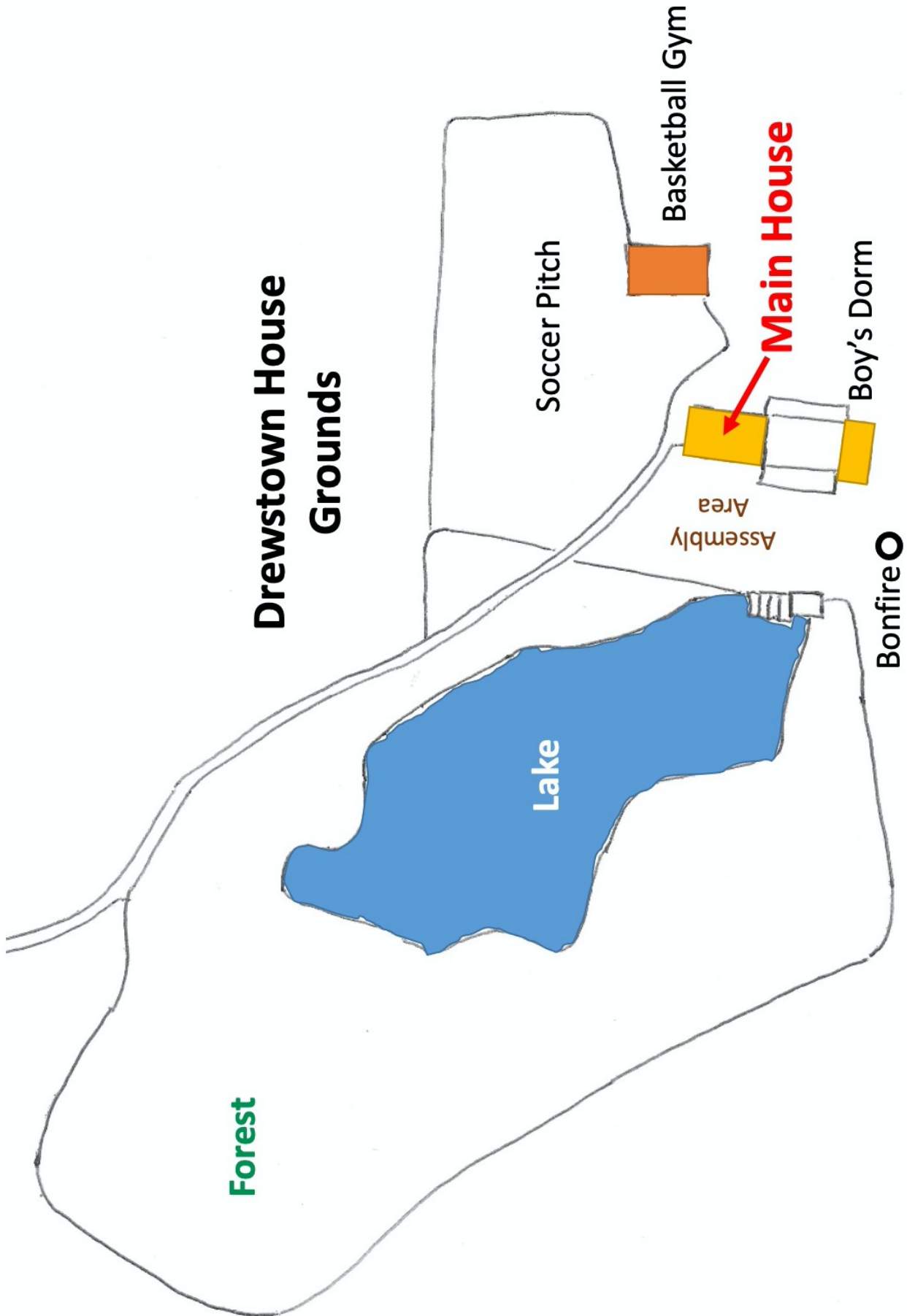

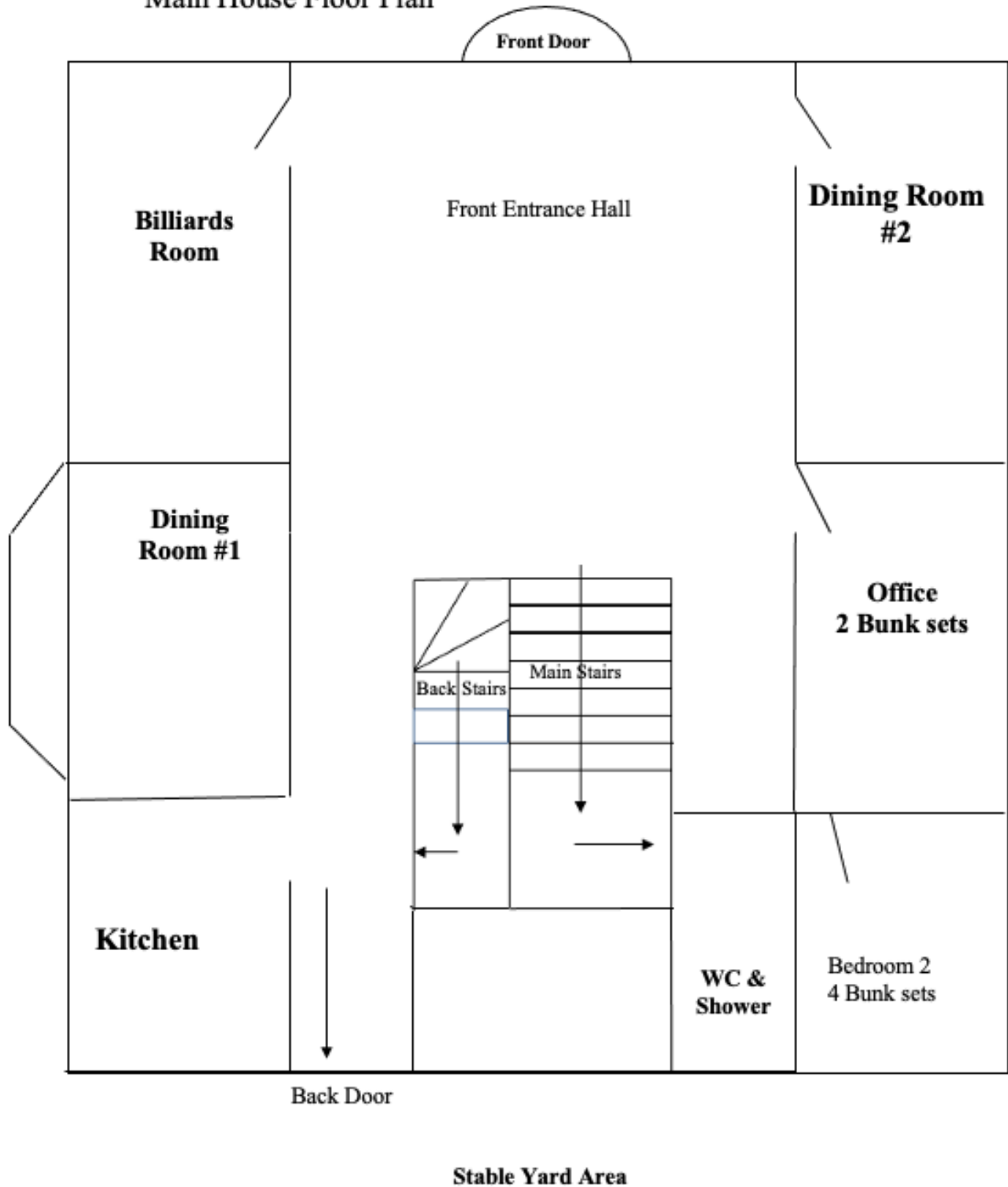

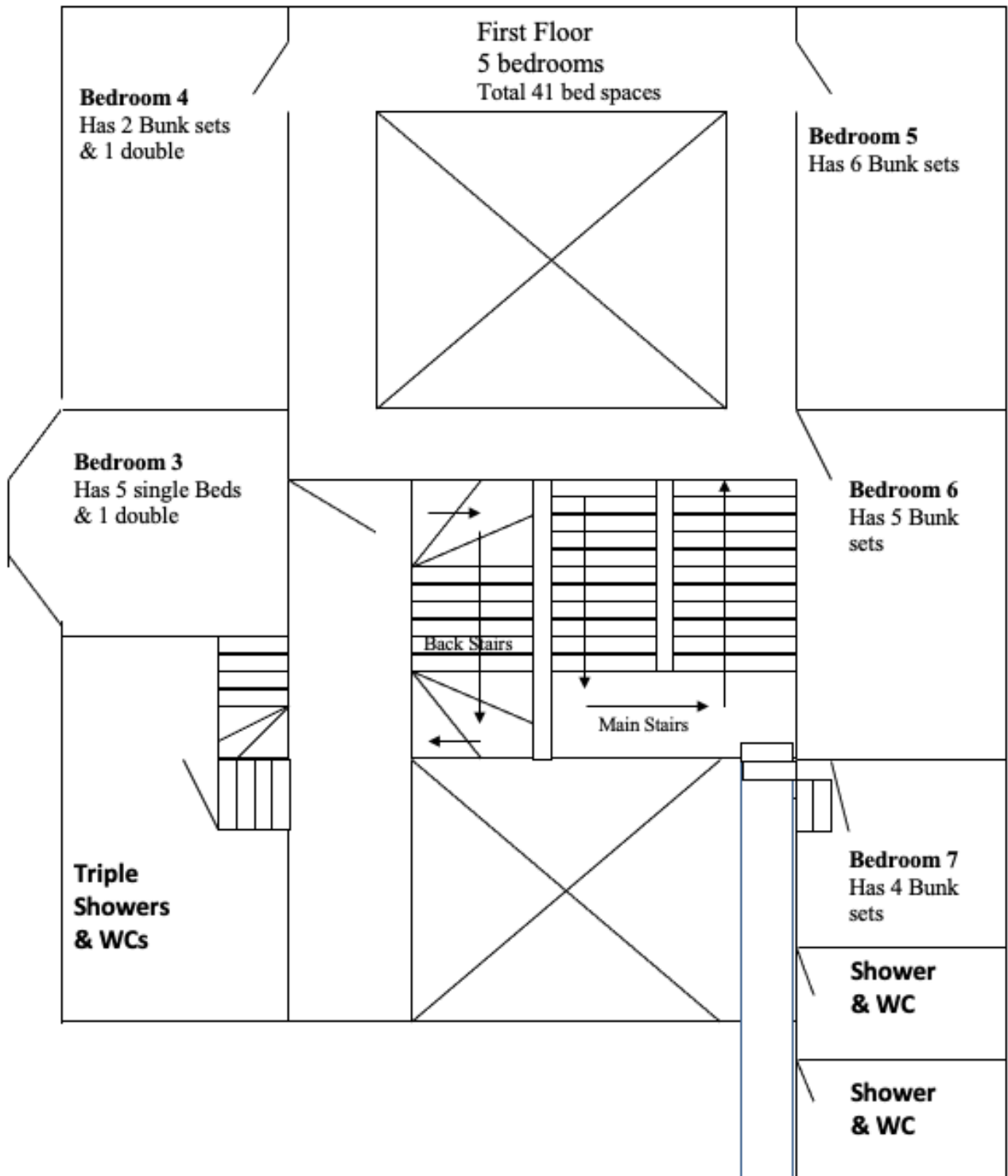
Campground Map

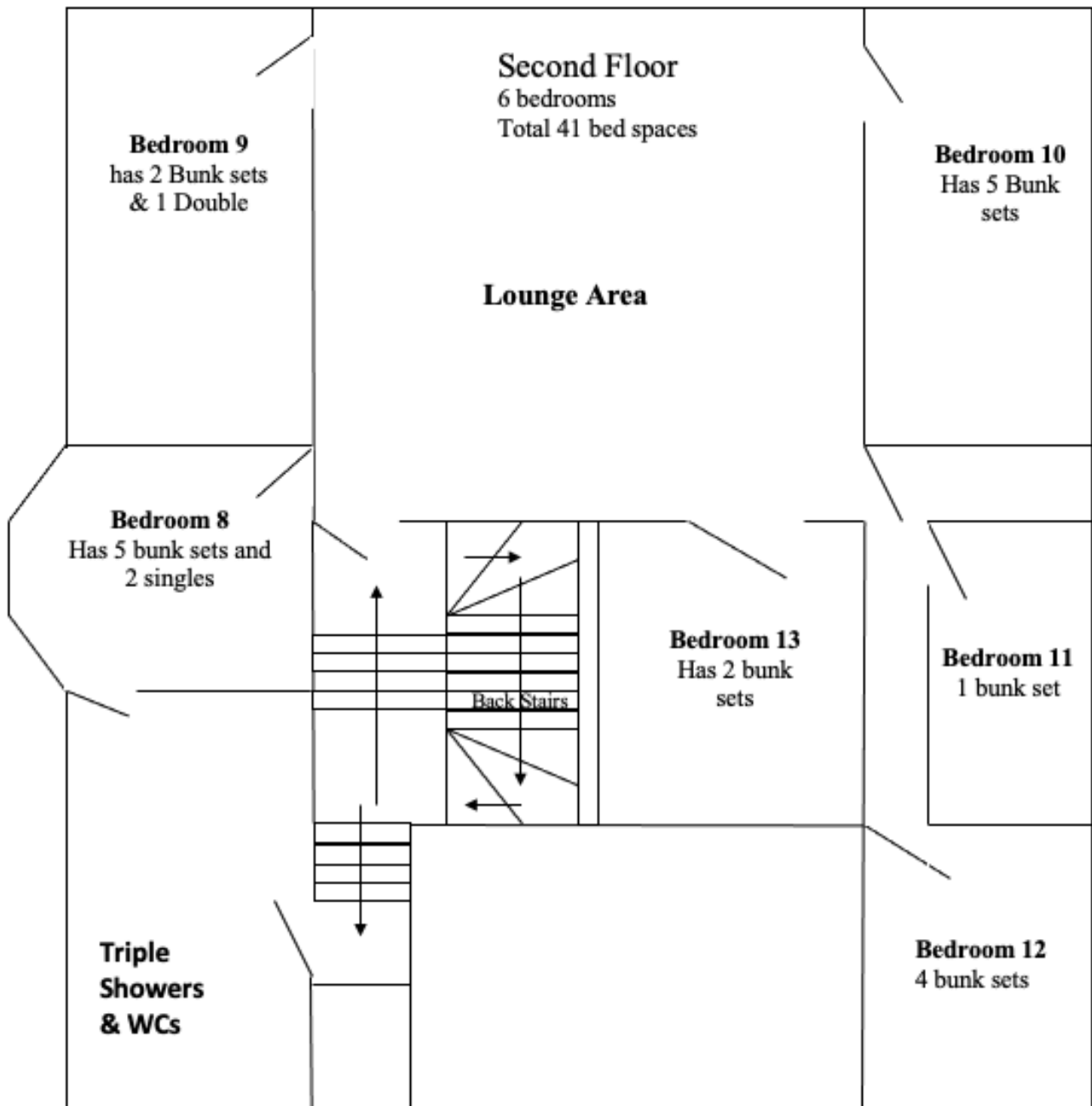


Room Layout Map

Drewstown House Main House Floor Plan

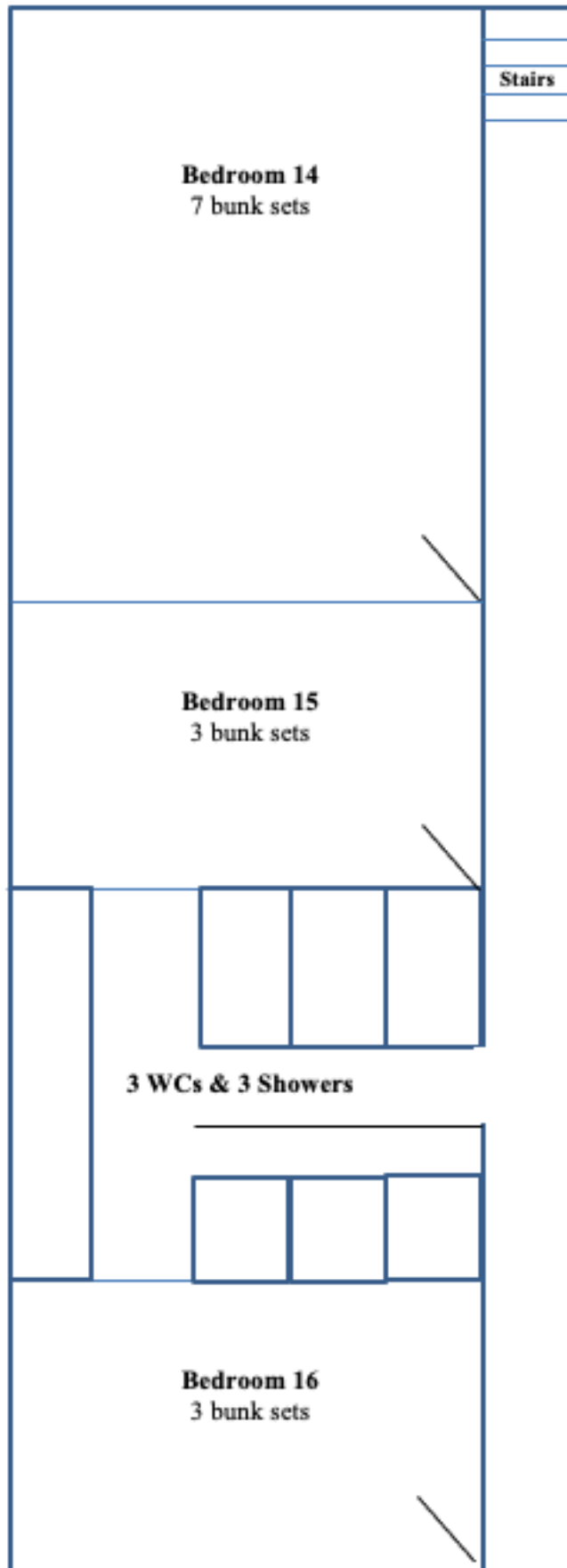






Drewstown House

Rules You Have to Obey While At Camp

1. The Camp Director and leaders will be obeyed at all times.
2. No one is allowed to go outside of the Camp grounds without permission from the Camp Director – period!
3. All mobiles and headphones, will be turned into either your Church Leader, or to the Camp Director upon arrival at camp. Use of mobile phones will be allowed once a day and will be strictly monitored. If you are using a mobile phone inappropriately, then you risk losing it, and you will lose points for both yourself, and your team. If your parents need to contact you, they must ring either your church leader or the Camp Director.
4. Keep your Camper Handbook, put your name on it – don't lose it!
5. Don't leave your stuff lying around – keep important things in a backpack.
6. Keep your hands off other people's stuff.
7. Every meal, a team will be selected to wash the dishes and clean the dining hall – do your tasks without complaining – the better the attitude, the more the points!
8. No profanity will be allowed
9. No rock or worldly music will be played at all at camp – Camp Director decides
10. No *boy and girl* things going on
11. No knives – if you have one, give it to your Church Leader, or to the Camp Director until Camp is over and he will return it.
12. No smoking or drinking any alcoholic drinks.
13. No going behind the buildings, or going out through the windows
14. No guys going into girl's rooms, and no girls going into the guy's rooms – ever!
15. No one except adults are allowed into the Adult or Family rooms
16. No wearing of a hood unless it is actually rainy.



How to Earn Points

Getting Points (Be sure to have your handbook signed and dated by a counsellor when points have been given)

- Every Scripture verse you memorize, you get 100 points!
- If you memorize all the 6 key verses (in yellow) you get 2,000 Extra points!
- If you memorize ALL the verses, you will get 2,000 extra points on top of them!
- The first full team present and seated for Chapel gets 1,000 points! Every time!
- Every Team Cheer, or Skit will get points for that team based on how good they are!
- Clean Bunks will result in 100 points being given to the person.
- A completed Bible Word Dictionary will result in 3,000 points for that person.
- Every Sermon or lesson that you take a full page of notes on will get you 500 pts.
- Every Devotion Page completed will get 500 points.
- Every time the Camp Director sees a person with great zeal, they will get 500 pts.
- Every puzzle and quiz page completed will get 500 points

Losing Points – unless stated, breaking any of these rules has a limit of three warnings

- Every bed must be made and every room cleaned before breakfast – or else each person who leaves a messy bunk will lose 100 points.
- Every time someone on your team has a bad attitude, breaks a rule, or gets into a fight, they will lose 1,000 points.
- Arguing with a camp leader/counsellor will cost you 500 points.
- No one ever goes out of the camp unless they are given permission by the Camp Director. If you leave camp grounds without permission, you will be sent home.
- No boy is ever allowed in a girl's room, and no girl is ever allowed in a boy's room. If you disobey this rule, you may be sent home.
- No one is allowed to mess with the windows in the rooms. Do not touch the fire alarms!
- Everyone must obey their team leader and the camp counsellors at all times.
- Anyone caught doing intentional damage to the camp will have to pay for it, and may be sent home.
- Anyone going out of their room after curfew, or before 6am **may be sent home.**
- Anyone with more than three warnings will be sent home.

Who Were Adam and Eve?

Everything has a beginning: Nations, cities, religions, businesses, creatures, and even mankind. Understanding where people originated from has been a cause of division for decades. To truly understand the lives of Adam and Eve and their significance upon history, and even upon us today, we must go back to Genesis, the very beginning of all things...

In The Beginning – Genesis 1

God. That's where the story begins. From the very first verse of the Bible, we see God creating the world over the course of six 24-hour days in a majestic display of power and purpose, culminating in the creation of a man and woman made in God's image. God desired to create something as unique and special as He is and in His own image. God designed Adam from the dust of the ground. When God finished, He then gave His creation something spectacular – the breath of life from God Himself. It was with this breath that man, Adam, became a living soul, completely different from all the animals. Adam was created sinless and perfect with a physical body, a soul, and a spirit, reflecting the image of God's own divine Trinity. God's creative work was not complete until He made woman, Eve.



Life In The Garden (Genesis 2)

The difference between Genesis chapters one and two helps us understand more about Creation. Genesis chapter one is written as an overview of all of creation and what God did in the very first seven days. God reveals in Genesis chapter two a more in depth look at what happened on day six of creation.



In chapter two God designed an extraordinary garden called Eden for man and woman to live in. It had everything they could ever need and want for food and water. God also included two special trees – The Tree of Life in the very middle of the garden and the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. In this garden, God gave Adam some responsibility. He was to tend to the garden. He was also given a command – do not eat the fruit of the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. Adam was also told that if he did eat it, he would die that very day.

Why would God place a tree in the garden and then forbid Adam to eat from it? God wanted Adam to obey, but He gave him the freedom to choose. Without choice, Adam would have been like a prisoner – a robot – forced to obey. The tree presented a choice, with rewards for choosing to obey and severe consequences for choosing to disobey. When faced with a choice, choose to obey God.

After placing Adam in the garden and giving him the commandment regarding the Tree, God had a plan to give Adam a special gift – a help meet. Someone to be a companion and to help Adam. Before God would complete that plan, He decided to create all the animals and bring them to Adam to name. This reveals man's innate desire to name everything he encounters, and it is still within us today. People name their children, pets, rivers, mountains, cities, planets, stars, etc. after others or themselves. We have an unconscious desire to name everything that God has given to us, even our own identities on social media or games.

Upon finishing the job of naming the animals, God was ready to give Adam a special gift. As Adam named the animals, he probably noticed there was more than one of its kind. Yet, Adam remained alone. This was soon to be changed with and in God's timing! God put Adam into a deep sleep and as he slept, God took one of his ribs. From this piece of Adam's flesh and body, God created Eve and brought her to Adam. With giving Adam and Eve to each other as His special gift, God created

the concepts of family and marriage. He illustrated for us that in marriage, man and woman symbolically and spiritually become one flesh. This is a supernatural union of the couple's hearts and lives. Throughout the Bible, God always treats this union very seriously. The goal in marriage should be more than just friendship; it should be oneness with each other.

God finished His work upon the sixth day. On the seventh day, He rested. He was not tired from using His great power. He was creating an example and pattern for mankind to follow.

Adam & Eve's Disobedience (Genesis 3)

Man had an enemy who sought to destroy him. Lucifer (Satan) had been banished from his role in Heaven due to his rebellion against God (**Isaiah 14:12-15, Ezekiel 28:11-17; Luke 10:18**). He wanted to destroy God's best creation. Satan is very sly and cunning, and he had a plan to get Eve to disobey God.

Satan approached Eve in the form of a serpent. Through his questioning, he put doubts into Eve's mind about what God truly said and that God did not want her to become just like God and to know



good and evil. He told her that she would not die if she touched the forbidden fruit, which was true. But he purposely withheld telling her that eating it would cause her to die. As she thought on these things and came to the tree, she saw the fruit, and it looked very delicious, and she really wanted to be wise like God. She tentatively reached for the fruit, grabbed it, and held it. She did not die. If she did not die from touching it, did God lie to her about eating it and that the serpent was right? She chose to eat the fruit and afterward she brought it to Adam. Adam knew exactly what it was. Yet, he chose to love Eve more than God and he ate the fruit.

As God warned, the moment they ate the fruit, a part of them died inside them – their spirit.

They were so overcome with the guilt of their disobedience that they realized they were naked, and felt ashamed. They had lost their innocence and were now sinners before God! Sin will always make you pay more than what you want to and will always take you farther than you wish to go. To cover their shame and nakedness, they sewed together some big fig leaves, and then they ran and hid from God.



God knew what had happened and saw the whole situation. He was greatly saddened by their choice to disobey, but He still had mercy and grace for them. To give them a chance to repent and confess, He called out to Adam, "Where art thou?". God even asked Adam if he ate of the tree. Instead of repenting and confessing, Adam blamed Eve for bringing him the fruit, and he also blamed God for giving Eve to him in the first place! What a sad turn of events.

God then asked Eve what she had done. He was giving her an opportunity to repent and confess what she had done. Instead, just like Adam, she blamed the serpent for tricking her. God then brought judgment upon all three, which is still being experienced today. The serpent would forever crawl on its belly and be cursed and feared among all animals. God gave a prophetic judgment that one day God, through man, would fix once and for all what Satan created. Until then, the serpent would hate man, and man would hate the serpent. Upon Eve, God said she would have pain in childbirth and in her physical cycle. She would need his leadership in her life. Upon Adam, God said the ground would now be cursed with thorns and thistles. He would need to work hard to produce food to eat. Upon them both, God judged that they would one day physically die and return to the ground.

God then made a coat of skins for Adam and Eve, revealing a glimpse of God's eternal plan of salvation through the shedding of the blood of the Lamb of God – Jesus! Without the shedding of blood, there is no remission of sin. Adam and Eve could no longer live in Eden, and they were banished from the garden. To keep it secure, powerful angels with flaming swords were put at the entrance. Though Adam and Eve could not return to Eden, they were not abandoned by God. He would watch over them and be there for them whenever He was needed.

A New Beginning

In time, Adam and Eve began to have children. They made tools and built a home. They planted food. They worshipped the God who had made them, and gave them each other, and had saved them from certain death. But death still came for them.



The “Last” Adam. Who Is He?

Man was a special part of God's plan. Adam was the beginning of that plan, but there would be another “Adam”, or a Last Adam as Scripture calls him, that would fix what Adam's sin created. This Last Adam would be God here with us incarnate (in the flesh). The first Adam was a man specially created by God as the beginning of the human race. 4,000 years later, the Last Adam, was God becoming flesh, to save the human race. Adam was tempted and chose to sin and disobey God, and became a sinner. Jesus was also tempted in every way like we are today (**Hebrews 4:15**) yet He always chose to obey God and was completely sinless because of it. God promised in Genesis a Messiah would come one day and crush the lying serpent's head. That day was when Jesus died on the cross! Until then, all the sacrifices of the Old Testament pointed everyone towards the Last Adam, Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God.



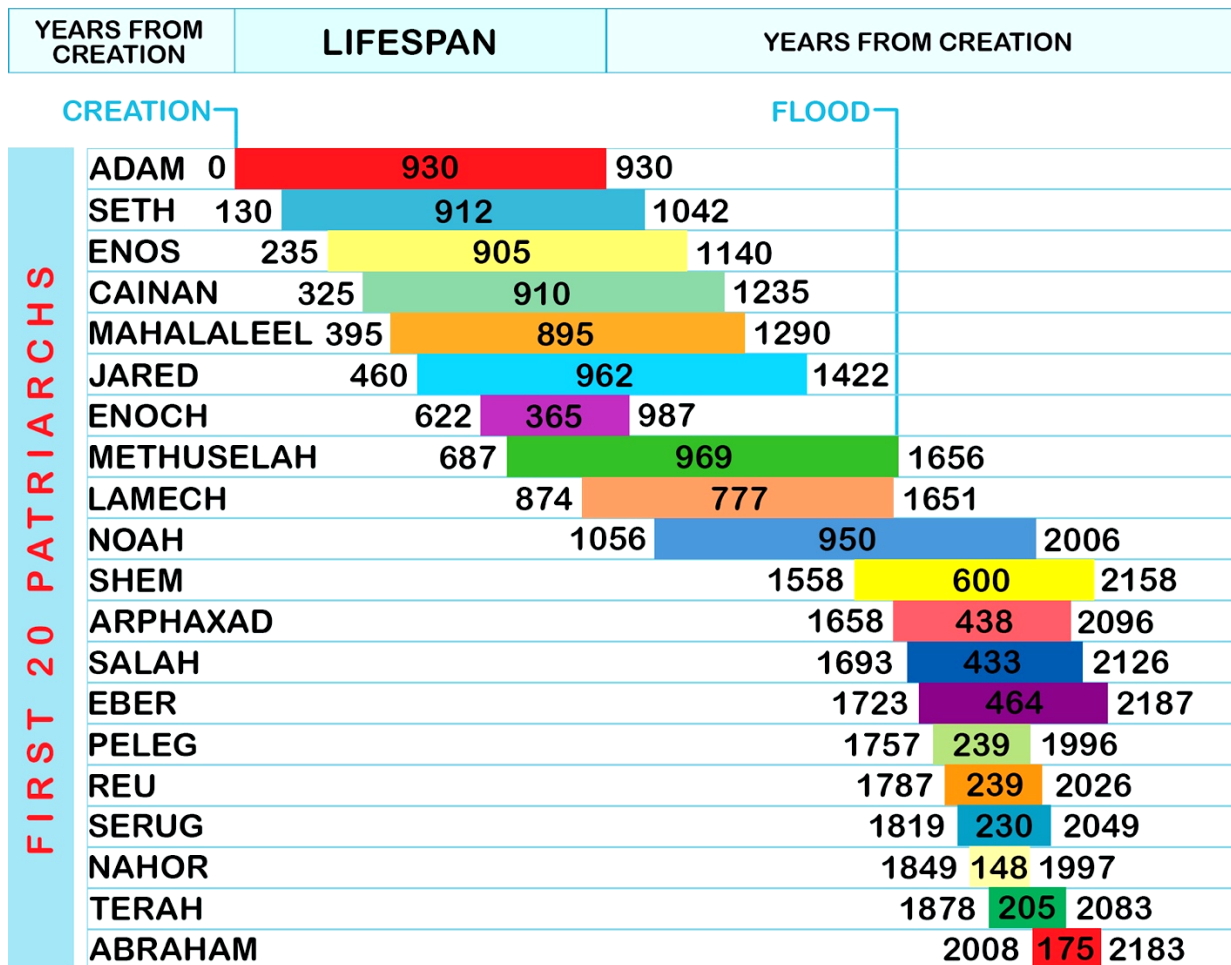
Adam's disobedience brought death upon all mankind. Jesus' obedience brought life eternal to all who believe in Him. After 930 years, Adam died physically. But death could not keep Jesus dead. And on the third day, He rose from the grave by His own power. Because He conquered death and is the author of all life, He can freely give eternal life to all who will believe upon Him for salvation.



Jesus is not finished. One day soon, God the Father will tell Jesus to fetch His bride, and all those who are born-again Christians will be raptured (brought up) to Heaven (**1 Thessalonians 4:13-17**). After seven years, He will return to earth as King of kings and Lord of Lords and will rule for 1,000 years. When He returns, all those who refuse to become a born-again Christian will be destroyed and cast into Hell. (**Revelation 19:11-16, 19-21**). Everyone throughout history who refused to trust God and Christ will stand before God one last time and give an account why they did not trust Christ as their Saviour. If their name is not found in the Lamb's book of life, then they will be cast into the Lake of Fire for all of eternity (**Revelation 20:10-15**).

Has there ever been a time in your life that you repented of your sin (all the bad things you've done) and asked Jesus to forgive you, and save you like he did Adam and Eve? **Romans 10:13** says, “***For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.***”

The first number in the above chart is the number of years from the creation of the World.

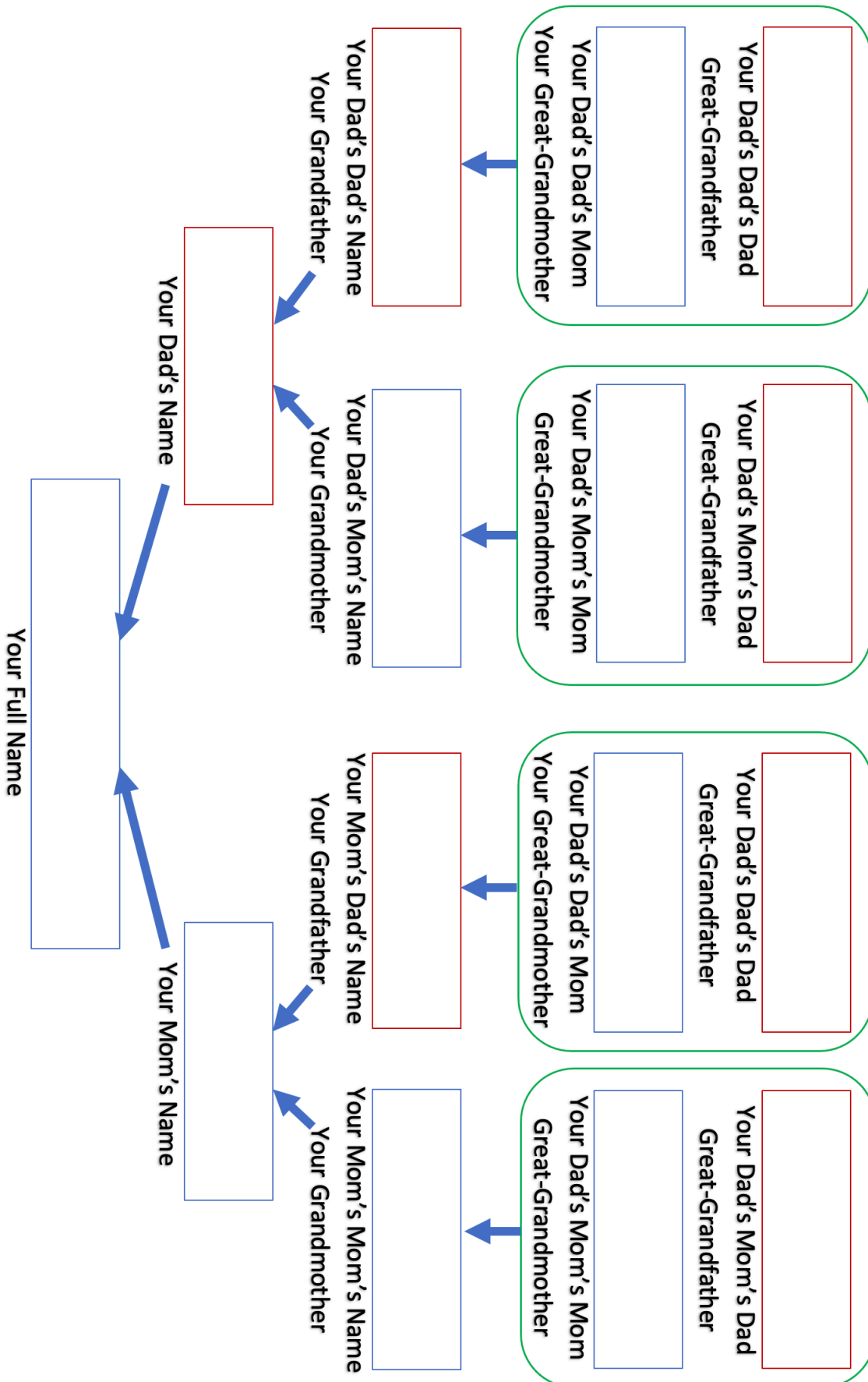
The middle number is the number of years the person lived.

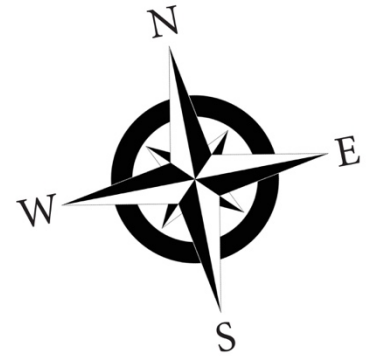

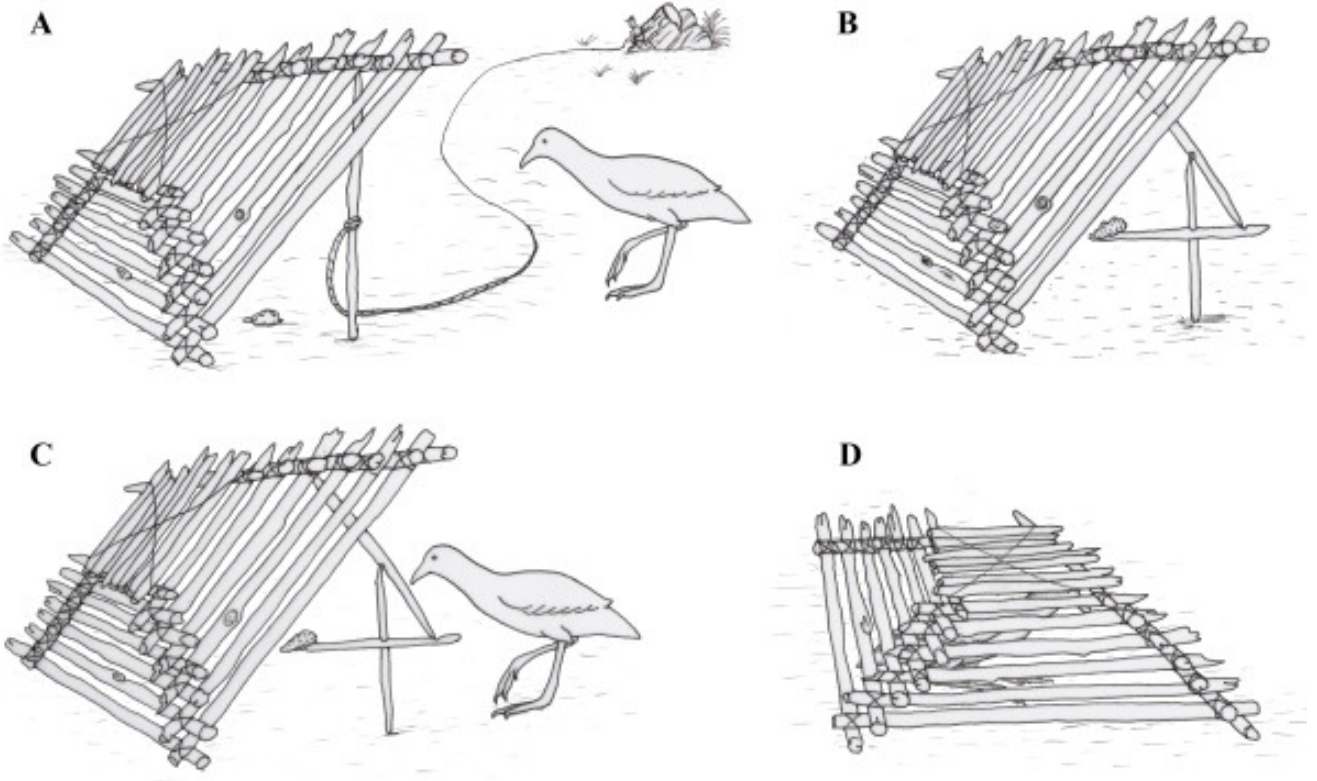

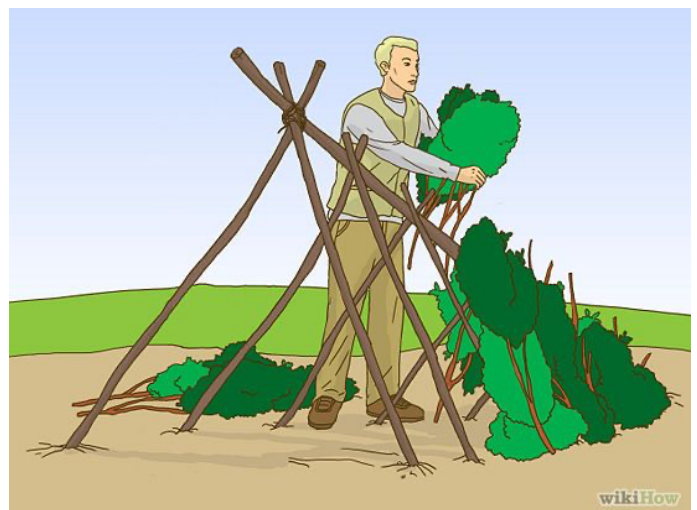

Tuesday Time with God

Consider What God Made When He Made YOU (Genesis 1:27, 31)

When God created our universe, from the farthest galaxy to the smallest molecule, He just spoke everything into existence. Genesis chapter 1 verses 3,6,9,11,14, 20, and 24 all begin with “*And God said...*”, and planets and mountains, and plants and animals all appeared! THAT is amazing power! Do you have that power?

But when God made the first Man and Woman, He did something better! He created them in a totally different way. He didn’t use His words, he used His HANDS! The Bible says that God formed man from DUST on the ground with His own hands (like a potter), and then breathed into their nostrils His own breath of life! We were specially made by God!

That means that you are NOT an accident. God designed everything you have: your hair colour is perfect. Your eyes and height, they’re perfect too! Even your personality was designed by God to fit His plan for your life. There are some wonderful things that God specially made that make you, YOU! He gave you your parents, your grandparents, the country you were born in, and your gender. What about the colour of your eyes? Was that an accident? What is your eye colour? _____ Your hair colour? _____. How tall are you? How many toes do you have? _____ Who designed all that? _____.

King David wrote in Psalm 139:14, that we ALL were “_____ and _____ made”. Fearfully means don’t touch or change what God has made or else you will be in trouble, and wonderfully means every detail of our body is amazing – nothing is wrong with us! Is there anything you wish you could change about you? _____

_____. Was God pleased with everything He created? (Gen. 1:31) Yes / No. We shouldn’t be discouraged about who we are, where we come from, the way we look. And, we should never think that we are somehow made by God better than others, because “every thing” and every one was “very good.”

So, if I’m smart, if I’m beautiful (or handsome if you’re a guy!), if I’m funny, if I’m musical; whatever talents I have, I should thank God that I am the way I am. Because everything I am, I received from God as a GIFT. So let’s be grateful for the way God made us!

God also says in Genesis 1:27, that He created us humans as two different kinds of people: “_____ and _____”, which means men and women are different. God created Adam first, but God saw that Adam needed a best friend, a helper, and a completer. Do you know the name of Adam’s helper? _____ She was made specially for Adam, and Adam was made specially for her. Many try to teach today that women can be men, and men can be women. Do you think that is true? God’s word, the Bible teaches, that from the beginning, God created all women and men wonderfully different from each other, and yet both were made a little bit like God. We were all made “*in the _____ of God*”.

What do you think that means? Does God look like a young boy? Or like an old man? Do any of us look like God? Does God look like us? No. There is nothing on the OUTSIDE of us that is the image of God. But on the INSIDE of everyone of us, is something that IS like God – our SOUL! We sometimes call the soul, our heart. Our heart (soul) is the part of us that will live forever! And in our heart is where the real us reflects the wonder and beauty of our Creator! But it is also the part of us that sin has invaded and has ruined. Thankfully God wants to enter, and clean up, and live in our HEART! Not in our heads, or our pockets! That is why Jesus came from heaven, and was made like you and me, and then took the punishment for OUR sins, and nailed all our sinful thoughts, and sinful words, and sinful actions onto the cross with Him – so that every heart in the world could be restored and made clean!

Family - sometimes we just love them, and sometimes we wish we could get some replacements! Have you ever thought that? Sometimes our homes are the one place we can be ourselves, places of comfort and inspiration; other times they are places of constant fighting and selfishness. Family can either be one of the best things in your life, or one of the hardest things.

When we look at Genesis and the world's first family (Adam and Eve), we see God that created family! but sin and selfishness snuck into our world and ruins even a perfect family.

The biggest enemy of your family is WHAT? It is SIN. The Bible says "*for _____ have sinned...*" (Romans 3:23). That means every member of your family are sinners, and selfish, and rude, and hurtful to each other.

Sin ruined Adam and Eve's family! Everybody blamed each other. Adam's own children were sinners and Cain murdered his own brother! What other kind of sins can ruin a family?

Do you ever get jealous of one of your brothers or sisters?

Do you ever disobey your parents?

Have you ever lied to someone?

We all hate to be wrong and we hate to take the blame. But God says we need to be willing to admit when we're wrong, and be willing to truly forgive when others have hurt us!

Loving your Mom, your Dad, your sisters and your brothers is the only way to treat each other. And when they aren't treating you right, God says to forgive them anyways, and love them anyways. It is the only way to keep the devil from destroying what God made when He made YOUR family!

Let's pray for our Mom's, Dad's, sisters and brothers to be safe from Satan's lies and attacks!

The Power of Memorizing Scripture

Matthew 4:4 *But he answered and said, It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.*

When the devil approached Eve as a beautiful snake, he asked her about what God said about a tree. But Eve didn't remember God's words very well.

Read out loud their conversation in Genesis 3:1-3.

Now read out loud what God actually said back in Genesis 2:16,17. Did you notice that Eve ADDED some words? What words did she add? _____ And then the devil tricked Eve with a lie by TAKING SOME OF GOD'S WORDS AWAY. What did Satan convince Eve was not what God said? _____

If only Eve had remembered exactly what God said, she would have been able to unmask the devil as a liar! She would have been able to kick him out of the Garden! And Adam and Eve, and all of us would have been able to stay in the beautiful Garden of Eden forever!

But she didn't think it was important to memorize every word that God had spoken.

So, as we finish Camp this year, we have one last truth to ponder... the importance of memorizing and remember every word of God in the Bible!

Let me give you an example: If you were asked to make a cake, could you remember what ingredients go into making a cake? Try and list as many of the ingredients of a delicious birthday cake as you can remember in the long squares below – it's okay if you don't know (I gave you the first thing you will need... 1 cup of flour):

Okay. Now go back and write how much of each item is needed in the smaller squares.

Do you think you remembered all of them? Do you think it is important to remember all the ingredients, and to have the right amounts?

Well, it is the same with the words of God. Every word of God is needed to fight off temptations, and the devil. If you made and baked a cake but forgot the eggs, how do you think it would taste? Not great! A cake needs EVERY ingredient in its right amount to be tasty - and the Christian needs every word of God, as written, to work against the devil! Why?

Because **the words of God are life-giving words** – they clean up our dirty hearts, and tell us how to be forgiven and how to walk with God!

They repel the devil! Jesus used the Bible in Matthew chapter 4 like a sword! Each time Jesus quoted God's words exactly, the devil was cut down!

The words of God also expose lies. People lie about everything. But when you know, and have memorized what God said, you can tell when people are lying, and stay away from them!

And best of all, **God's words give the person who believes them joy and strength and freedom!** Unfortunately, people who do NOT know what God said, are easily tricked, and trapped by the devil. Do you want the devil to trick YOU? Yes / No

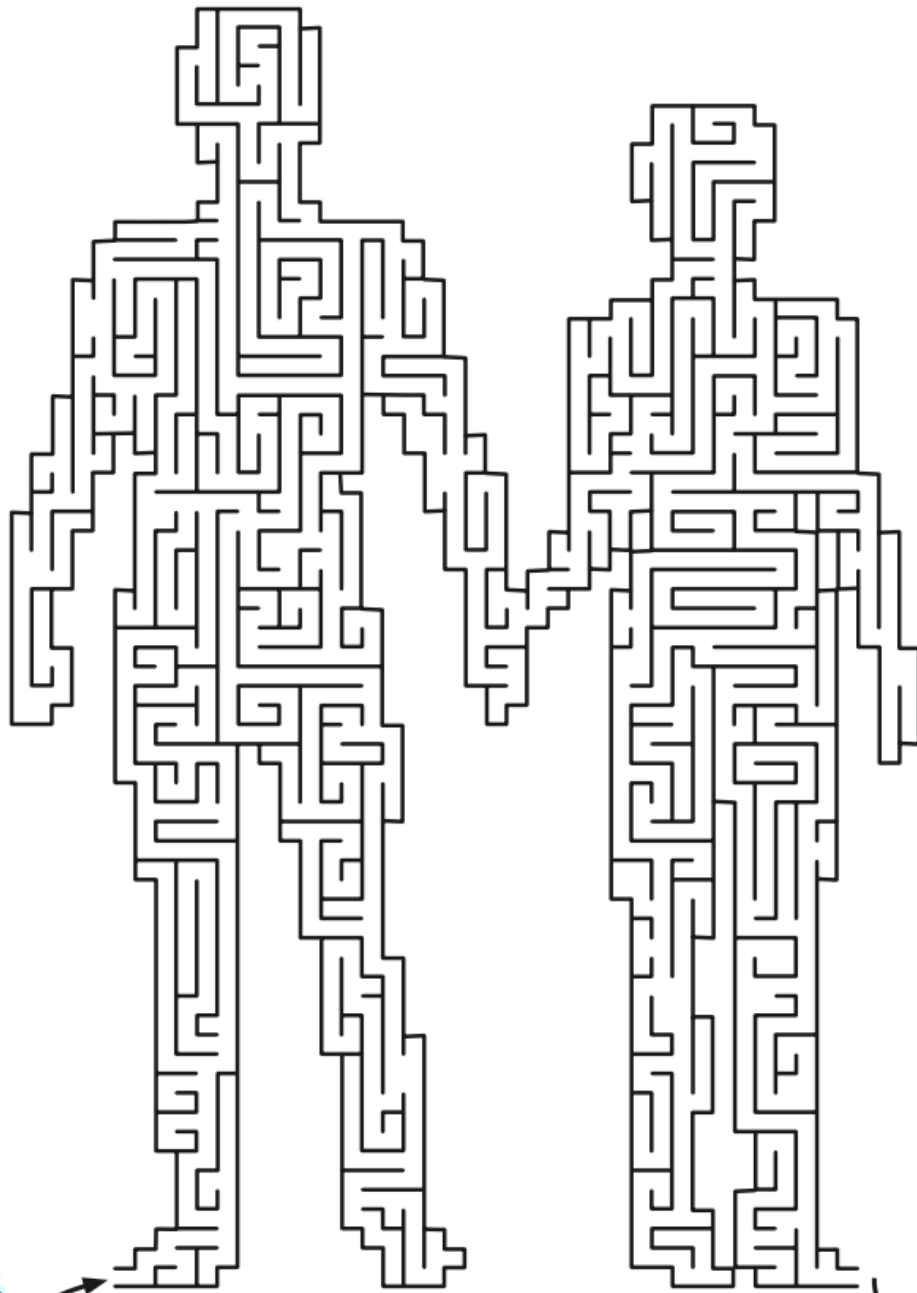

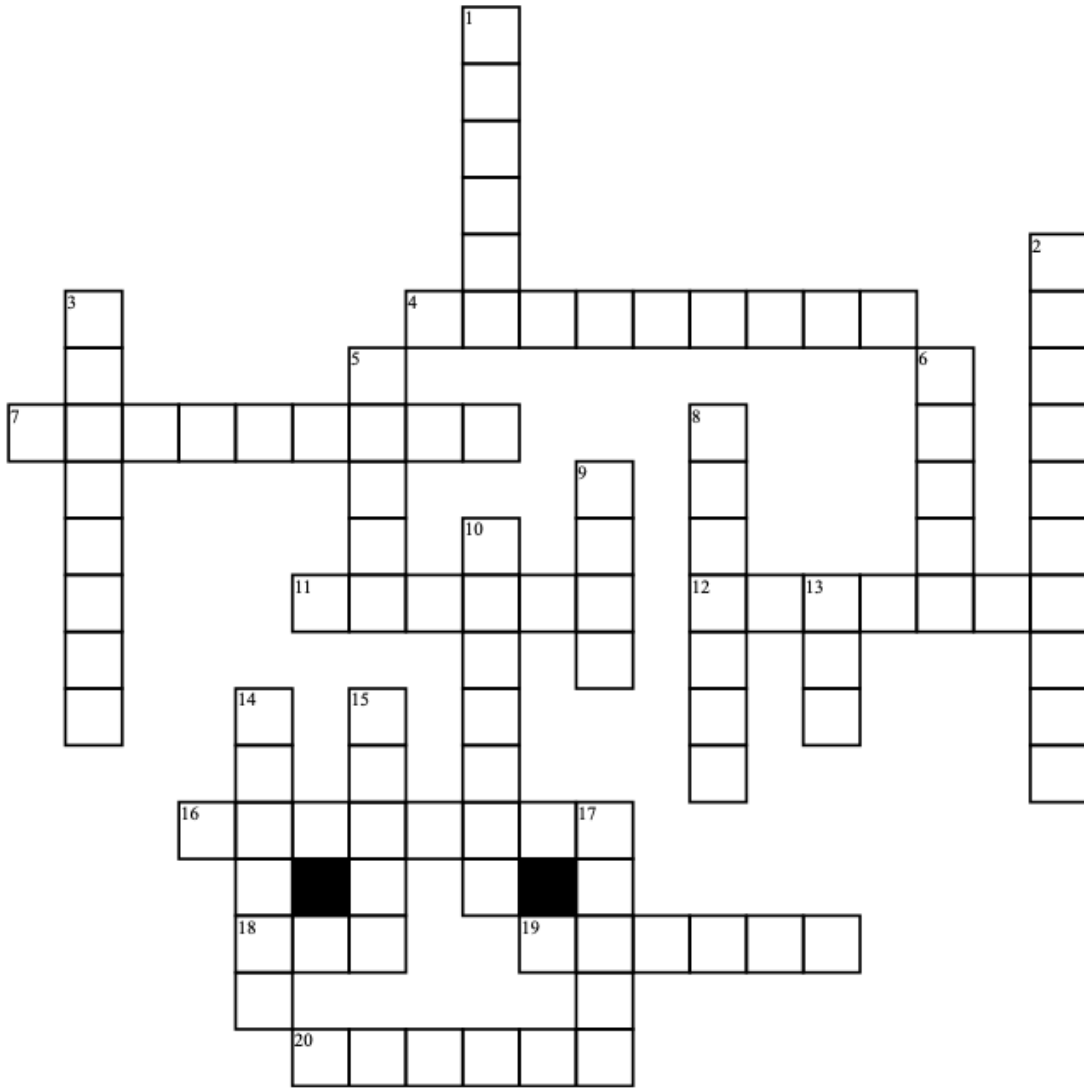
