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

Summary of Job

All Hell Breaks Loose

There is a time in every life, when all hell breaks loose. Suddenly. Unexpectedly. Completely. One day, life is sunny, calm, clear, predictable. Your job is secure. Your children behave. Your health is good. Then out of the blue, like lightening, tragedy strikes. You're hit hard. All hell has broken loose. And it happens to "good" people all the time!

So, why do bad things happen to good people? Why does tragedy seem to strike those who love God the most? Why do the good die young? Job asked all these questions. He suffered so deeply that his wife couldn't stand it anymore. She said to her husband, "Curse God and die". In other words, "It's no use. There is no future." Yet rather than choosing suicide, Job clung tenaciously to life. Unfortunately, human tragedies like the loss of career, family, or home often leads to an even greater tragedy - the denial of any meaning to life. This was the great temptation that faced Job, and faces each of us every couple of years.

Job went through horrendous suffering for 42 chapters, and yet he never once gave up. He was tormented by insults from his friends, harassed by insensitive advice and browbeaten into admitting wrongdoing he never committed. Under attack, Job groaned, wailed, doubted and fell into deep depression. He lashed out like an infuriated animal... but he never cursed God. No matter how discouraged he was, *he clung to his integrity*. Thousands of years later, we modern, sophisticated people are still often judging people when they become sick. We too easily are just like Job's three "comforters" who just made their friend feel worse. "Oh, you're sick in hospital with cancer... Obviously you are not thinking enough positive mental thoughts, or jogging enough, or eating enough fibre." One way or another, we can slip into the sin of blaming others for their illnesses and troubles.

Job was covered from head to toe with oozing boils that never stopped itching. His feverish body hung limp on the ash heap, his eyes sank back into his head, and his ribs protruded from his skin. Job didn't need a lecture from his three friends; he needed love. He didn't need a sermon; he needed sympathy. He didn't need criticism; he needed comfort. When we are struck down by tragedy, we need to know that our friends really care. And we need to know that God cares, that He really listens, and that He will never leave us.

Why is it that so many writers, poets, philosophers, and scientists have turned to the book of Job? Perhaps because it easily takes its place among the masterpieces of the world's literature. The author of Job powerfully expresses our deepest feelings and thoughts. Sooner or later, we all identify with Job because suffering is life. We are connected to Job through our common experience of pain. Many people reject God, but no one rejects Job. Simply by suffering so greatly and hanging on for dear life through it all, Job has won our hearts.

Sometimes in life, heaven is silent. In such times, the only answer God gives is a deeper revelation of Himself. We learn that <u>He</u> is the answer we seek. Ultimately we must not trust a plan, but a Person. There is something about our questioning minds that longs for answers. We think that "If we only understood why, then we could handle our pain." Yet placing God's infinite wisdom into our finite brains would be like trying to pour the Atlantic Ocean into a tea cup. It just wouldn't fit. It's far too vast and deep.

Through the trial, Job's faith wavered. He mourned. He cried. He protested. He questioned. He even cursed the day of his birth. But he never cursed God. In the face of adversity, he remained firm in his only hope - God. When our world falls apart unexpectedly, we must not dwell on WHY but only on WHO. Only God's revelation of Himself is powerful enough to heal the heart and relieve the pain. Though he slay me, said Job, yet will I trust in Him. (*An adaption of some thoughts by Ed Hird*)

Summary of Job Page 7

Background on the Book of Job

Author: The Book was written by a man named **Elihu** (Job 32:16).

Date of Writing: The date of the writing of the Book of Job would be around 1800 B.C. It is the oldest book in the Bible written just after the time of Abraham.

The Place it all happens: In an area of Edom called Uz, near to a city called Petra.

Purpose of Writing: The name Job means "*Persecuted*'. Job helps us to understand the following:

- That Satan cannot bring trouble upon us unless it is by God's permission.
- That God has power over what Satan can and cannot do
- That it will always be beyond our ability to understand the "why's" behind all the suffering in the world.
- That the wicked will receive their just dues one day.
- That we cannot always blame our suffering and sin on our lifestyles. Suffering
 may sometimes be allowed in our lives to purify, test, teach or strengthen us.
- That no matter what we may go through, God remains God, and deserves and demands all our love and praise in all the circumstances of life.

The PURPOSE of Job then is to RIGHTLY understand life's testings so that we will faithfully serve and trust God especially during difficult times.

Key People in the Book, There are 10 people in the book of Job:

- 1. Job means "persecuted" he lived to be about 200 years old!
- 2. Job's children (7 boys and 3 girls)
- 3. Job's wife
- 4. Satan our enemy, adversary
- 5. Angels (the Sons of God)
- 6. God Almighty He will actually speak as face to face with Job
- 7. Eliphaz the Temanite his name means, "God is my strength"
- 8. Bildad the Shuhite his name means, "Son of contention" i.e., an arguer!
- 9. Zophar the Naamathite his name means "Doubtful" the harshest critic!
- 10. Elihu his name means, "He is my God" he rebukes Job correctly

Practical Application: Don't get angry at God, no matter what happens in your life. Use problems to strengthen your character and bring glory to God. Refuse to be proud when people attack you. Do you ever feel like God has left you to face your problems alone? Trust God to work in your life day by day, and trial by trial. Let God be your source of security, not anyone else!






