



This weekend, tear down every idol that is stopping you from being godly. Because this world, our churches, and especially our families need to see more godly men!



Introducing David's Mighty Men 1 Samuel 23 Can you fill in the missing information?

This weekend, we will go on a journey. A journey back in Bible times to the days of David. Deep into the rocky wilderness of Judaea. There are no trails where we are going. In fact, there are very few men who even know the exact place of our destination.

We will head out of Bethlehem towards the southeast. Everything is off-road here as we set off into the hills. This is wilderness land, a wild land, a land of hills, caves, and rugged valleys. Our destination is the stronghold of Engedi, a hideout in the hills just west of the shores of the Dead Sea.

Our purpose for this study is to catch a glimpse of a rare breed of men. The Bible calls them, "Mighty Men" (**2 Samuel 23:8**). These are men who loved David, were feared by the Philistines and Amalekites, and were admired by the Israelite women and children they defended. They are honoured in the Scripture as examples of what Biblical manhood ought to be.

To appreciate the kind of men they were, we have to throw out all of our modern notions of manliness, success, and strength. That means erase from our minds the picture of the twentieth century man, sitting on his couch watching sports while his kids play video games. The contrast between our modern culture and the days of the mighty men of David could not be more extreme.

You see, in the Mighty Men of David we find real manhood and true heroism. And God has recorded the lives of these men so that we might learn and profit by their example "For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our _____, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope." (Romans 15:4)

Today, we live in a world full of selfishness, a world empty of righteousness. And we Christians are for the most part to blame. An unsaved man knows no better than to live only for himself. He is selfish and carnal because he is his own god. But Christians should know better!

There should NOT be any selfish, carnal, lazy, and apathetic Christians. Believing men, blood-bought men, born again men, should be, by the grace of God MIGHTY MEN - men that lead their wives and children in holiness, obedience to God's law, and genuine godliness. Men that are glad they are men, who take the lead when called upon, who give glory to god when things go well, and take responsibility when they don't.

Yet, Biblical Christianity stands in peril, with most Christian men sitting idly by, dozing in their apathy, soaking in the world, comfortable in their easy chair in their mancave, distracted by their own entertainments and pleasures, their minds dulled by the barrage of images, sights, and sounds of the modern world.

In the very midst of such a sinful culture as ours is today, and in the midst of a lukewarm church that has caved in to wishy-washy Christianity, God is searching for some mighty men.

The Stronghold of the Wilderness of Engedi

One of the wilderness abodes of David was known as Engedi. These are the barren wastelands west of the Dead Sea.

Engedi, which means "the spring of the wild goats" was one of David's many hiding places. It was a natural fort that he and his men could hide in. Almost no one could find them once they were there. You would have to hike many tortuous miles through the winding gullies and over the jagged boulders just to get where David and his men stayed for weeks and months at a time. There was no path. There were no signs. This hiding place was very, very hard to find. King Saul tried countless times to find the very place, but to no avail.



Meet Their Leader - David



David is a young man that God calls, "*a* ______*after mine own heart.*" (Acts 13:22) David is not even 30 years old, and yet he is considered by these men, worthy of following, obeying, and dying for!

Now, outwardly, David has nothing in this world. He is an outcast, hated by the Philistines, hunted by Israel's King Saul, and hiding in caves in the southern wilderness. What does David have to cling to? Why does David press on and lead these men?

All he has is a distant memory, of a day, many years earlier, when a prophet named Samuel visited his home and poured a horn of oil upon his head, announcing that David was chosen by God to be the next king of Israel. Deep in his soul, David believed the promise of Samuel. But now it has been many years later, and David is not the king yet. He is still waiting, hiding here in the wilderness of Judaea. But he is still believing!

Around David Sit His Men

You could not call them an army, because no two men are dressed alike. They were rough, with no medals or pageantry. Their arms are brown. Their hands are calloused, not from the plough, but from the sword. Their faces are weathered from a thousand nights spent in the wilderness air. They are armed with all sorts of crude weapons. The Bible tells us in **1 Samuel 13** that during this period of Israelite history, the Philistines controlled the availability of all weaponry in Israel. In fact, the Bible says in **1 Samuel 13:19** that there was no blacksmith in all of Israel, so almost no one had swords of their own. As an example, at the battle of Michmash, a few years before David slew Goliath, the only two Israelites that owned swords were Jonathan and king Saul (**1 Samuel 13:22**).

Thus, David's mighty men are anything but properly equipped for battle – at least as far as what people today would expect. They were armed with all sorts of simple weapons:

<u>Staves</u> - A wooden staff (pole) between 2 and 2.5 meters in length, sometimes with a metal tip or spike at one or both ends.





<u>Spears</u> - A spear is a pole weapon consisting of a shaft, usually of wood, with

a pointed head. The head may be simply the sharpened end of the shaft itself, as is the case with fire hardened spears, or it may be made of a more durable material fastened to the shaft, such as flint, obsidian, iron, steel or bronze. The most common design for hunting or combat spears since ancient times has incorporated a metal spearhead shaped like a triangle, lozenge, or leaf. The heads of fishing spears usually feature barbs or serrated edges.


Javelin - A javelin is a heavy spear designed primarily to be thrown by hand.

<u>**Bows and arrows</u>** - A weapon made of a curved piece of wood or other flexible material whose ends are connected by a string, used for shooting arrows. Arrows were wooden projectiles consisting of a shaft, a point, and a tail with stabilizing fins</u>

<u>Slings</u> - A sling is a projectile weapon typically used to throw a blunt projectile such as a stone, clay, or lead "sling-bullet". It is also

known as the shepherd's sling. A sling has a small cradle or pouch in the middle of two lengths of cord. The sling stone is placed in the pouch. The middle finger or thumb is placed through a loop on the end of one cord, and a tab at the end of the other cord is placed between the thumb and forefinger. The sling is swung in an arc, and the tab released at a precise moment.

<u>Swords & Knives</u> - a tool with a cutting edge or blade, hand-held or otherwise, with most having a handle. Some knives were a double-edged combat knife with a central spine and edges sharpened their full length, used primarily for stabbing. Swords



are longer versions of knives and are designed to inflict a lethal injury in a physical confrontation between two or more individuals at very short range.


<u>Axes</u> - an arm-length tool borne in one or both hands. It delivers more cleaving power against a smaller target area, making it more effective against armour, due to concentrating more of its weight in the axe head.

<u>**Clubs</u>** - Among the simplest of all weapons: a short staff or stick, usually made of wood, wielded as a weapon since prehistoric times. Most clubs are small enough to be swung with one hand, although larger clubs may require the use of two to be effective.</u>

As well as all sorts of crude farm implements like:

<u>Coulters</u> - A vertically mounted knife-like blade component of many ploughs that cuts an edge about 7 inches (18 cm) deep ahead of a ploughshare. (#4 in diagram)

<u>Ox-goads</u> - A long, pointed stick used to prod animals. The Israelite judge, Shamgar, slew 600 Philistine men with such a stick in **Judges 3:31**.





<u>**Pruning hooks</u>** - a long-handled pruning saw with a curved blade at the end and sometimes a clipper; used to prune small trees.</u>

<u>Mattocks</u> - A versatile hand tool, used for digging and chopping, similar to the pickaxe. It has a long handle, and a stout head, which combines an axe blade and a pick.

<u>**Large Stones**</u> – These were men who could throw massive rocks with deadly accuracy. The force of the impact of the rocks could crush bone, especially skulls.

<u>Scythes</u> - An agricultural hand tool for mowing grass or reaping crops.

<u>Mauls (sledgehammer)</u> - A tool with a large, flat, often metal head, attached to a handle. The size of its head allows a maul to apply more force than other hammers. This gives the maul the ability to distribute force over a wide area.

For these men, battle was tough, mean, and bloody. Combat was eyeball to eyeball, and knuckle to knuckle. Battles were often unfair and yet they pressed on. When you lost your scythe, you fought with stones. When the stones ran out, you fought with your bare hands, teeth, and nails. No quarter was ever asked. And no quarter was ever given. Every fight was to the death.

David's Elite

David's mighty men were different than David's main army. These men were the special forces, the select corps, the trusted few. David commanded 600 men, but at the end of David's life, only 37 qualified to be known as MIGHTY MEN.



They were soldiers who had distinguished themselves in David's army. Most of them had joined David early, while he was still a fugitive from king Saul. These men shared the difficulties with David of Saul's persecution. Some became part of his regular army and others later, when David became king. The mighty men were an odd assortment of warriors who had joined David's band for differing reasons.

1 Samuel 22:2 describes the first recruitment of David's band of men, "And every one that was in ______, and every one that was in debt, and every one that was discontented, gathered themselves unto _____; and he became a _____ over them: and there were with him about four hundred men."

So, at the beginning, this was anything but a unified army. Every conflicting interest was represented. Some men had joined for political reasons. Some had merely wanted out of their debt. Some simply had been looking for something different. Not all were Godly. Not all were heroes.

Of these, most did not last. But from these ranks of broken men developed a handful of thirty seven warriors who became the finest warriors in all the history of war.

Let's Take a Brief Look at Some of David's Mighty Men

<u>Adino</u> – What would you do if you were surrounded by an innumerable force of enemies that are seeking only to kill you? Adino was put in such a position several times and never backed down. He was also known as Jashobeam (**1Chronicles 11:11**), and he was the chief among all the captains of the Mighty Men. Adino stood up to, and fought against an army attack, and ending up slaying eight hundred men with just his spear. During an earlier battle, he single-handedly slew ______ men! In other words, Adino fought until there were no more enemies to fight! He was relentless and did not quit until the job was finished.



Eleazar - The son of Dodo the Ahohite. Eleazar was second behind Adino of the Mighty Men. During a battle in which the Philistines gathered together to attack the Israelites, Eleazar was the only man that stood between them and their destructive victory.



Everyone else able to fight was gone. The only ones left behind were the women and children. Eleazar knew he was their only defence, so he alone stood up to and fought against the Philistine attack. He fought on in spite of fatigue and he smote the Philistines until ______ (2Samuel 23:10), and his hand ______ unto the sword. What does that mean? ______.

When the Philistines were defeated, Eleazar could not open

his hand to let go of his sword. Though he did an amazing feat that day, he wasn't seeking praise for it. All the glory for the victory belonged to his Lord. He knew that it was God who gave him the strength and courage to press on and to continue fighting when it was easy to quit due to fatigue. It is interesting that all the men only returned after the battle in time to enjoy the spoil of the battle. It is obvious that Eleazar was tenacious and determined. He didn't just "talk" about what he was going to do against the Philistines, he got up and did it!

<u>Shammah</u> – The son of Agee the Hararite. Shammah was one of the three mightiest men in David's army. The Philistines were always a threat to the Israelites. One day, they attacked a field of lentils (beans), hoping to take away the food supply of the Israelites. Those who were working in the fields there fled, and only man left to guard the fields was Shammah. Shammah knew the importance the crops

were to Israel's survival. This field of beans may not have seemed important to anyone else, but Shammah knew it was greatly needed. So, alone, Shammah stood his ground against the attacking forces of the Philistines. He did not regard their strength and military abilities, and did not want to let the enemy have any more ground. So, when the enemy came... they did not return home that day! What was one man against such an army? But they did not realize that ______ was with Shammah and that _____ gave him the victory (**2Samuel 23:11,12**). Though no man helped Shammah, he did have God! Shammah was purposed, unmoveable, unshakeable, and steadfast in his commitment to the fight. He realised there are some things worth fighting for against all odds.

<u>Abishai</u> – Abishai was David's nephew, and brother to Asahel and Joab. His father's name is never given, only his mother, _____

(2Samuel 23:18; 1Chronicles 2:16). Abishai was one of the first to join David when David was fleeing from Saul. Abishai was always quick to defend David but had to be kept in check. Abishai had great zeal and love for his king, even though he was his uncle. Abishai was a formidable warrior. In one battle, Abishai slew _____ men (2Samuel 23:18) with his spear! Abishai came to David's rescue when Ishbibenob,

brother of Goliath, sought to kill David when David was fatigued from the battle. In another instance, Abishai led his men into battle and slew ______ Edomites in the valley of salt (1Chronicles 18:12). The Bible calls Abishai ______ (2Samuel 23:10). He was far from perfect, but he desired to serve David without question and

23:19). He was far from perfect, but he desired to serve David without question and became one of the three top captains of the Mighty Men. Abishai was an able commander and his brother, Joab, knew he could always trust his brother in battle.

Benaiah – Benaiah was a Mighty Man from an unexpected background. His father, Jehoiada, was a chief priest, the son of a valiant man of Kabzeel. Benaiah was strong, trustworthy, and loyal. Of his physical strength accomplishments, he slew two lionlike men of Moab, and another time he went down and slew a lion in the midst of a pit in the snow. In another battle, he slew an giant sized Egyptian. The Egyptian had a spear in his hand and Benaiah went down to fight him with only a staff (a stick). Benaiah ended up plucking the massive spear out of the Egyptian's hand and then killed him with his own spear! David placed Benaiah in charge of a group of men called the Cherethites and the Pelethites, who were the bodyguards of king David. David trusted Benaiah with his life and his family. Solomon would one day make Benaiah the overall general of his army. Benaiah was a godly man and his children and grandchildren continued to serve the Lord even until the days of king Jehoshaphat.

<u>Uriah</u> – The name of this man is usually only associated with David's sin of adultery with Uriah's wife, Bathsheba! But Uriah was not just a nobody that happened to be married






to Bathsheba. Uriah was actually one of David's best men! See **2Samual 23:39** where he is listed last in the list of _____ Mighty men of David!

Uriah was a Hittite - a Gentile, not a Jewish man. Yet, as a convert to faith in Jehovah, he was a person with more honour and virtue and integrity than David ever had. Uriah had left his pagan nation and people and had joined with David. God blessed Uriah as he served under David. God even gave Uriah a beautiful Israelite wife named Bathsheba. He became well known as a cunning and skilful warrior, and became part of David's Mighty Men. Sadly, the greatest test of his integrity came from those whom he loved the most. Both his wife and king betrayed him in their sin of adultery. To cover up her pregnancy, David recalled Uriah from the front lines of battle and told him to go home to his wife. But Uriah instead stayed in the barracks with the rest of David's servants. Uriah felt that as long as all the other soldiers remained in the fields, he could not go to his home and enjoy comfort and be with his wife. David then caused him to become drunk, hoping Uriah would go home and be with Bathsheba, but he would not. He went back to where the servants slept and would not go home. Desperate, David called him the next day and gave him special instructions to give to Joab. David knew Uriah would not look at the message. It was Uriah's own death sentence. Upon giving it to Joab, Uriah was placed at the fiercest part of the battle near the city walls, and the rest of the army pulled back. That left Uriah abandoned, and he was slain. His final defeat was at the hands of his own king, his wife, and his general. And through it all, he stayed courageous, faithful, and true!

There are just some of the Mighty Men of David listed in 2 Samuel, and 1 Chronicles. But they are dead and gone. Today, we desperately need Mighty men of God! Men who are willing to fight for souls, for righteousness and holiness, and against Satan, and sin. Men who STAY in the fight. Who hold onto their weapons (the word of God, prayer, preaching, soul-winning, believing God), never dropping them, never exchanging them for anything inferior... all so that OUR nation, our families, our testimonies would be protected, and would be blessed of God!

Will you join with the few, the courageous, the determined, Mighty men of God?

A Man's Quiet Time How Does a Real Man Walk with His God?

Please read this simple explanation of how to prepare your heart for a daily serious time with God through His word. It will make all the difference in the world to come humbly before the throne of grace. **Hebrews 4:16.** We need God's help!

Start with Prayer! Find yourself a place every day to get alone with God. Remember Matthew 6:6 "But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet..." It is when we are by ourselves seeking the Lord that we hear His still, small voice. Start with opening your heart to God. Allow Him to do an inspection of what is in your thoughts and feelings. Psalm 139:23 says, "Search me, O God, and know my heart: try me, and know my thoughts." Be honest with yourself, and honest with God. Ask God to search for any sins you may have buried in your heart. Psalm 139:24 says, "And see if there be any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting." David, realizing he had sinned against God, asked for a cleansing. God wants us all very clean in our hearts! Psalm 51:2 says, "Wash me throughly from mine iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin." Let God cleanse your life as you do the following three things: 1. Acknowledge - admit the sins He reveals are there in your heart. 2. Confess – admit that you have sinned before an all holy God. 3. Forsake – leave each sin, abandoning everything that has separated you from God. Decide by God's power to quit doing the same sins that God reveals to you in your quiet time, and has already forgiven, and cleansed you from. Remember the Lord's promise – 1 John 1:9 "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Humble yourself. The Bible says in Isaiah 57:15a, "For thus saith the high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy; I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit..." We have a great need every day to humble ourselves as we prepare to walk with God. This means there must be a **personal brokenness** to cause us to always depend upon the Lord. God wants to fully "dwell" in our heart, but He will not force His way in, nor will He honour a sinful, wicked heart. Once your heart is clean, tell God you are coming under His perfect authority, and that you want to obey Him all day long. God desires to fellowship with you, but only with the right attitude!

<u>Tell God what you need!</u> Cast all your worries, cares, and every need upon Almighty God. He loves to answer our impossible prayers! He delights to have our strength renewed in our daily walk with Him. Believe God wants to give you a peace and strength far beyond what we are used to. So, pray about everything! Real men don't fight, get angry, frustrated, and defeated when things don't work out. Real men, pray and trust God to do for them every thing they themselves cannot do!

<u>Read at least two chapters</u> every day from Genesis to Revelation in your Bible!

Finally, Thank Him for His Blessings – Read and meditate on these verses. **Philp 4:6** "*Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.*" **Col 4:2** "Continue in prayer, and watch in the same with thanksgiving." We have got a lot to be thankful for. Write some blessings on your heart and mind right now. Praise Him for His goodness to you!

Weapons and Warfare Class

"Blessed be the LORD my strength, which teacheth my hands to war, and my fingers to fight." Psalm 144:1

Introduction I.

- A. These are four sets of lessons that teach spiritual application to the weapons, enemies, and targets of this Camp
- B. The major weapons in ancient times were:
 - 1. Bows and slings for long range
 - 2. Javelins for medium range
 - 3. Swords, axes, spears, staffs, and maces for short range.
- C. Let God TEACH you this weekend how to fight the good fight of faith with weapons beyond the ones you hold in your hands!

II. What do we need to know about our enemy? (1 Peter 5:8)

- A. He is smart smarter than you ever could be.
- B. He knows you

- E. He MUST be defeated never tolerated, or ignored!
- F. Any Christian man CAN defeat Satan (James 4:7)!
- G. Besides Satan, our enemies include:
 - 1. Old habits
 - 2. Demonic attacks
 - 3. Temptations to sin against God
 - 4. The world's culture and lies that we tend to believe and hold onto

III. What can we learn about Bows and Arrows?

- A. Bows are the means to sending an arrow to a target.
- B. Arrows are the actual weapon that inflicts damage to the enemy
- C. What a bow and arrows are to the Christian Man (_______
 - 1. The Bow
 - a. Is the Bible the word of God
 - b. It is strong, and able to deliver truth after truth after truth that strikes at every lie, and every temptation
 - c. It withstands the pulling and stress of the fight
 - d. When used correctly, it is the foundation of our strength
 - e. It is doctrine, and absolute
 - The bow is a symbol of victory (**Psalm 7:12**) f.
 - g. It is the source of a Christian's confidence



h. So, strengthen YOUR bow (Genesis 49:24) – keep it taut!

- 2. The Arrows
 - a. Arrows are truths that the bow (the Bible) propels at our enemies
 - b. They are sharp, and pointed, and straight like God's truths are
 - c. They pierce into the flesh They cut to the heart
 - d. Arrows (truths) only work when they are aimed at a target
 - e. Have many Scriptures memorized just as Jesus did in Matthew 4.

IV. What can we learn about Spears, and Javelins? (_____

- A. A spear is a pole with a sharp, pointed head at its tip.
- B. Spears and javelins are both for use in close combat and can also be used to attack and kill your enemy at great distances.
- C. Saul threw a ______ at David when he was upset with him (**1 Samuel 18:10,11**).
- D. To use a spear:
 - Your eye must be kept on your target your enemy. You have got to keep your eye on the enemy - "*Be sober, be vigilant*"



- 2. You have to throw the spear or javelin with all your might you can't just "toss" it and have any effect on your enemy.
- 3. Always keep the spear between you and him like keeping the Word of God in your heart so that when Satan attacks, he can't get beyond the truths you have memorised (**Psalm 119:11**)
- 4. When the devil attacks pull out your spear and thrust home a verse of scripture, just like Jesus did. (Matthew 4:4)
- E. Javelins had to have the right balance to be the most effective. A Christian man needs to also have the right balance in his life between family, work, and ministry. When one area is out of balance it causes much damage to the others. A man can be so focused on his work that his family is discarded aside and it will crumble. A man could also be so focused on his family that he doesn't work and doesn't minister to other people.
- F. Think of the fact that you could throw your javelin of prayer or a believed truth from the word of God for a fellow soldier who is fighting in another part of the battle. So, no matter where we are in the country of Ireland, Christian soldiers should be fighting the same battle against the same enemy and we need each other's help in praying specifically for each other, and against whatever enemies they may be facing.


V. What can we learn about Slings and Stones? (______

A. A sling and a small stone are a very simple weapon, but is one of the most important one in a battle.

- B. Obviously, stones could be **slung** faster, farther, and more accurately, than
 - they could be thrown. Smooth, rounded stones were far more effective than any other shape of stone.
- C. Ancient hand slings generally consisted of a single long strip of leather or woven wool, with a central "pocket" for the stone. The longer the sling, the greater its range. Long-range slings were about 3 feet long.
- D. A sling is not a weapon in itself, but is designed to hurl specialised stones at the enemy.
- E. A sling can be used to direct a stone at a very precise target. See Judges 20:16 "Among all this people there were seven hundred chosen men lefthanded; every one could sling stones at an _____



- F. Slinging a stone accurately requires a lot of practice it is much harder to use effectively than you would first think.
- G. You need to have **many** stones at hand not just one or two. David chose not one, but ______ smooth stones (**1 Samuel 17:40**) to kill Goliath, and we have to make choices and decisions to fit the situations of life.
- H. A good slinger hurled a stone as far and accurately as a good archer. Roman military texts recommended archery target practice at about 200 yards.
 Slingers are known to hurl their projectiles even farther, as much as 440 yards (quarter of a mile).
- I. How to sling a stone
 - 1. One end of the sling was secured to the fingers of the throwing hand. The other end, held between thumb and forefinger, was released thus propelling the stone.



- J. Slings and stones are like ______ in the Christian Man's warfare
 - 1. Anybody can sling a stone only trained men can hit a target
 - a. When you witness to someone about Christ, it can feel intimidating and you may not get very far talking to someone for the first time, but the more you learn scripture and how to talk to people, the stronger witness you will be.
 - 2. Christian men need to be trained by others soldiers to learn how to make your sling (your testimony) and use it to the best of your ability
 - 3. Learning the power of the Gospel requires personal and group Bible study. 2 Timothy 2:2 *And the things that thou hast heard of me among*

in the Christian Man's mode

many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to ______ others also.

- 4. Think how a person grows in the Lord through discipleship Jesus trained His men so even when He wasn't there they would do even greater things. John 14:12 *Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father.*
- 5. That training enabled them to preach, and present the Gospel all over the world, defeating sin and Satan all along the way!

VI. What can we learn about Hand Axes, Large killing Stones, Swords and Shields, and weapons of any kind? (HUMILITY)

- A. Be ready to improvise. Your goal is to stay alive spiritually, and to defeat your enemy, and not everything will always work the way you want, so do your best with the tools you have
 - 1. All weapons were deadly in the Old Testament, but the Christian man must use big doses of "_____" (Matthew 5:43,44).
 - 2. So use YOUR HUMILITY to humble your enemy!
 - 3. Swords are just like the word of God (**Hebrews 4:12**) they cut and kill sin in both the wielder, and the opponent. Use the word of God in every fight and battle and argument NOT your own opinions and feelings!
 - 4. Shields PROTECT you from attacks of arrows, swords, stones, Spears, etc. Our shield is when a Christian man hides behind his FAITH, his confidence in GOD'S strength and protection (**Ephesians 6:16**)!
- B. Remember that weapons are not always exciting. They just need to be effective against our enemy. So also is the Gospel. It will not be exciting, and even seem foolish to the lost. But it is the "_____".
 (1Corinthians 1:18; Romans 1:16)

VII. Final Principles:

- A. 1 Samuel 17:47 "And all this assembly shall know that the LORD saveth not with sword and spear: for the battle is the LORD'S."
- B. Never trust your weapon trust in the Lord that uses simple, and base things, and uses even NOTHING to defeat the strongest enemies!
- C. Battle your enemy head on. Never turn your back on your enemy. There is no protective armour for the back of a soldier.
- D. Use your weapons and stay in the fight until your enemy, your temptation, your depression, your anger, your rebellion is DEFEATED! Elisha rebuked king ______ when he only shot ______ arrows out a window when he still had a quiver full left (2 Kings 13:14-19). So, keep attacking until you run out of ammunition or until the battle is over! AMEN!

Personal Devotion – Friday Morning Strengthening the Inner Man

That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man. Ephesians 3:16

Have you ever felt like you were two different people with different desires and thoughts? If you are born again and trust Jesus Christ as your Saviour, a part of you that was dead because of sin was _______, or made alive from that day forward (**Ephesians 2:1**). This new part of you is called the "New Man". It is in the invisible part of you called the soul. Your New Man wants to do what's right and to worship, obey, and serve God. Yet, there's still a part within every Christian man that is called the "Old Man" that does not want to obey God; does not want to worship, and does not want to do His will. Your Old Man is your old nature, and includes your old likes and dislikes, and your sinful desires and habits that you enjoyed before you were saved. Both your Old Man and New Man are constantly at war with each other and each seeks to be in control of your decisions on a daily basis. Sadly, most Christians live their lives with the Old Man in charge and wonder why they have no joy, no peace, no power, no walk with God, and no desire to serve God. If you do not strengthen your New Man, your Old Man will win most of the time. So, how do you strengthen your New Man? Here are a couple ways.

1. Realize your Old You was actually crucified with Christ when you repented and believed the Gospel. Galatians 2:20 I am ______ with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me. Jesus died to free you from sinful thoughts, habits and desires. Believe it!



2. Exercise your New Man. Find out what God says to do in the Bible, and then DO it, and your New You will become stronger and stronger. The more you do your own will, the more your old you will stay strong. James 1:22, 23 *But be ye _____ of the word, and not ______ only, deceiving your own selves.* If you don't exercise your faith, your will, and your heart to avidly, passionately follow the life of Jesus, you will always end up defeated by the sin that doth so easily ______ you (trip you up) (Hebrews 12:1). Every day, get up with a list of people's needs, and pray for every one of them. Read at least 2 chapters in your Bible. Carry tracts with you, and hand out at least one a day to someone you meet! That is exercise!

3. Desire good things, godliness, holiness, a Christian home, a clear conscience, a clean mind, a good testimony! 1 Timothy 4:8 For bodily exercise profiteth _____: but godliness is profitable unto _____ things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come.

4. Feed your New Man – starve your old habits. Just as we have to feed our physical bodies, our New Man must be fed. Your New Man does not use the same food that your physical body needs in order to survive. You need to start consuming spiritual food. God has given us all the spiritual food that we will ever need in His Word and we are fed by reading it. 1 Peter 2:2 As newborn babes, desire the sincere _____ of the word, that ye may _____ thereby.


5. Fear what your Old Nature can end up doing if you don't stay vigilant. Remember, David dropped his guard, and let his personal sexual lust act on a married woman named Bathsheba (see **2Samuel 11**)! You have no idea what YOU might end up doing if you do not take great care to never allow your lusts and old habits be in control anymore!

6. Last, Put up a good fight! Don't be such a baby, constantly giving in to the temptations to think wrong, and do wrong things. Whenever sinful, lustful, selfish thoughts start building up in your mind, start _____ (throwing) them back down, and breaking down every that the devil tries to set up (2Corinthians 10:4.5).






